Absorb spillage to prevent material damage.

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Inhalation:	Remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. Immediately call a POISON CENTER or doctor/physician.
Skin contact:	Remove/Take off immediately all contaminated clothing. Gently wash with plenty of soap and water. Immediately call a POISON CENTER or doctor/physician.
Eye contact:	Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. Immediately call a POISON CENTER or doctor/physician.
Ingestion:	Immediately call a POISON CENTER or doctor/physician. Rinse mouth. Do NOT induce vomiting.
Protection of first-aiders:	A rescuer should wear personal protective equipment, such as rubber gloves and air-tight goggles.

5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

Suitable extinguishing media:	Dry chemical, carbon dioxide.
Extinguishing media not to be used:	Water
Specific hazards:	Take care as it may decompose upon combustion or in high temperatures to generate poisonous fume.
Specific methods:	Fire-extinguishing work is done from the windward and the suitable fire-extinguishing method according to the surrounding situation is used. Uninvolved persons should evacuate to a safe place. In case of fire in the surroundings: Remove movable containers if safe to do so.
Special protective equipment for firefighters:	When extinguishing fire, be sure to wear personal protective equipment.

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures:	Use extra personal protective equipment (P3 filter respirator for toxic particles). Keep people away from and upwind of spill/leak. Entry to non-involved personnel should be controlled around the leakage area by roping off, etc.
Environmental precautions:	Prevent product from entering drains.
Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up:	Sweep dust to collect it into an airtight container, taking care not to disperse it. Adhered or collected material should be promptly disposed of, in accordance with appropriate laws and regulations.
Prevention of secondary hazards:	Do not allow contact with water. Remove all sources of ignition. Fire-extinguishing devices should be prepared in case of a fire. Use spark-proof tools and explosion-proof equipment.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Handling

Technical measures:	Handling is performed in a well ventilated place. Wear suitable protective equipment. Prevent dispersion of dust. Wash hands and face thoroughly after handling. Use a closed system if possible. Use a local exhaust if dust or aerosol will be generated.
Advice on safe handling:	Avoid contact with skin, eyes and clothing. May develop pressure. Open carefully. Use corrosive resistant equipment.

Storage

Storage conditions:	Keep container tightly closed. Store in a cool and dark place. Store locked up.

Packaging material: Store away from incompatible materials such as oxidizing agents.
Law is followed. Keep only in original container.

Engineering controls: Install a closed system or local exhaust. Also install safety shower and eye bath.

Personal protective equipment

Respiratory protection: Dust respirator, self-contained breathing apparatus(SCBA), supplied air respirator, etc. Use respirators approved under appropriate government standards and follow local and national regulations.

Hand protection: Impervious gloves.

Eye protection: Safety goggles. A face-shield, if the situation requires.

Skin and body protection: Impervious protective clothing. Protective boots, if the situation requires.
